Introduction

- Medication safety is a shared responsibility.
 - Ensures better outcomes and prevents harm.
 - Involves everyone: doctors, nurses, pharmacists, support staff, and patients.
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Why Medication Safety Matters

- 1 in 10 hospital patients experiences medication errors.
- Errors can lead to adverse drug events (ADEs), hospitalization, or worse.
- Most errors are preventable.

Common Causes of Medication Errors

- Look-alike/sound-alike drugs
- Wrong dose or route
- Poor communication
- Illegible handwriting
- Inadequate patient education

Role of Doctors

- Write legible prescriptions
- Confirm allergies and history
- Use evidence-based guidelines
- Collaborate with pharmacists

Role of Nurses

- Follow '5 Rights':
 - 1. Right patient
 - 2. Right drug
 - 3. Right dose
 - 4. Right route
 - 5. Right time
- Double-check high-risk meds
- Report and document errors

Role of Pharmacists

- Verify prescriptions
- Educate patients and staff
- Monitor drug interactions
- Stock and label medications properly

Role of Paramedical Staff

- Assist with proper storage
- Help in patient counseling
- Ensure sterile preparation
- Support error reporting

Role of Patients

- Know your medications
- Ask questions
- Report side effects
- Carry a medication list

Best Practices for Medication Safety

- Use electronic prescriptions
- Regular training and audits
- Encourage open communication
- Implement safety checklists

WHO's 3rd Global Patient Safety Challenge

- “Medication Without Harm”
- Goal: reduce severe avoidable medication-related harm by 50% over 5 years
- Focus on transitions of care, polypharmacy, high-risk situations
